Team USA (4-0-0-1) vs. Finland (3-1-0-0)

April 21, 2010 • 3:30 p.m. • Semifinal Round

• **TODAY'S CONTEST** -- The U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team will meet Finland in the semifinals of the 2010 International Ice Hockey Federation World Men's Under-18 Championship. The winner of today's game will go on to face either Sweden or Russia in the gold-medal game Friday at 7 p.m. at Minsk Arena.

• **MATCH-UP HISTORY** -- Today's game represents the 10th meeting between the U.S. and Finland at the IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship. Team USA has won each of the last six match-ups between the two squads and holds a 6-3-0 record against today's opponent. The last meeting between the two clubs came on April 11, 2009 in the preliminary round. The U.S. earned a 4-3 decision in that contest. Today's contest will be the first time the two teams will meet in a semifinal game, with eight of the previous nine contests coming in the preliminary round or round robin. The two squads faced off at the 2006 IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship gold-medal game. The U.S. won that game by a 3-1 score to earn its second consecutive gold.

• **ABOUT FINLAND** -- Finland earned the bye into this semifinal after winning Group B with a 3-1-0-0 record. The Finns boast the tournament's top point-getter in Teemu Pulkkinen who has recorded 12 points including a tournament-best seven goals.

• **A FAMILIAR PLACE** -- The U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team will be playing in the semifinals for the ninth consecutive year. The longest such streak in tournament history. The U.S. has posted a 7-2 record during that stretch. In its most recent semifinal game, in 2009, Team USA defeated Canada, 2-1, in front of a home crowd in Fargo, N.D. At the 2004 IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship, also held in Minsk at the Sport Palace, the U.S. edged the Czech Republic, 3-2, to set up a date with Russia.

• **LAST TIME OUT** -- **Austin Czarnik** (Washington, Mich.) netted three goals and **Jack Campbell** (Port Huron, Mich.) made 11 saves as the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team shut out the Czech Republic, 6-0, in the quarterfinal round. **Rocco Grimaldi** (Rossmoor, Calif.) posted three assists, each coming on goals by Czarnik.

• **STAT LEADERS** -- The U.S. has outscored its last four opponents, 23-2, thanks in large part to scoring from all lines. **Adam Clendening** (Niagara Falls, N.Y./2-6--8) and **Rocco Grimaldi** (1-7--8) pace Team USA with eight points each ... **Austin Czarnik** is the leading goal scorer for the U.S., with five. Eighteen of Team USA's 20 skaters have at least one point, while 14 have more than one point ... Clendening and **Derek Forbort** (Duluth, Minn.) are tops on the squad with each posting a plus-7 rating ... **Jack Campbell** has been the top goaltender, statistically, at the 2010 IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship. He leads all netminders with a 1.00 goals-against average, a .958 save percentage and two shutouts. Campbell has posted an astonishing 0.87 goals-against average, having allowed just seven goals in nine career games at the IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship, to go along with four shutouts. Additionally, Campbell's career save percentage sits at .962 ... Opponents might just want to start passing on power plays against Team USA. The U.S. side has killed 93.8% of its penalties in this event, tops, allowing just two power-play goals on 32 disadvantages ... Team USA ranks third in power-play efficiency, having converted 26.9% of its power plays ... For complete player statistics, see page 4.

• **TIDBITS** -- FASTHockey is providing live webstreaming of Team USA's remaining games at the 2010 IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship. All games will be available on a pay-per-view basis for the remainder of the tournament using FASTHockey's unique game credits system. For more information, visit USAHockey.FASTHockey.com ... In addition, USAHockey.com has coverage of the tournament including game recaps, photos and a tournament blog ... Team USA is familiar with Minsk having just competed in the 2010 Under-18 Six Nations Cup that took place here in February. ... The U.S. is in the same exact locker room it occupied in 2004 at the last IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship held in Minsk ... **Jason Zucker** (Las Vegas, Nev.) now has 12 career points (5-7) at the IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship, which ties him for eighth all-time among U.S. players. **Adam Clendening** has 10 career points (2-8) at the tournament, which is tied for 15th all-time.

• **BACK IN BELARUS** -- The U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team has earned medals in six consecutive IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championships. That unprecedented streak all started in Belarus back in 2004, when John Hynes led Team USA to the silver medal in his first year as coach. That team included such standouts as Phil Kessel and Jack Johnson.

• **CAPTAINS** -- **Jarred Tinordi** is the captain of the 2009 U.S. Men's National Junior Team. The native of Millersville, Md., has served as the captain for the 1992 birth-year team at the National Team Development Program since December of 2008 ... Team USA has four alternate captains, two in blue jerseys and two in white jerseys. **Nick Shore** (Denver, Colo.) and **Stephen Johns** (Wampum, Pa.) are alternates when Team USA wears white, while **Jason Zucker** and **Frankie Simonelli** (Bensenville, Ill.) each have an "A" in blue.

• **A FAMILY AFFAIR** -- Three members of the U.S. Men's National Team have family ties to this tournament. **Nick Shore's** (Denver, Colo.) brother, Drew, was part of the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team that captured gold at the 2009 IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship. **Bryan Rust's** brother, Matt, competed at the 2007 IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship where Team USA took home silver. Lastly, **Austin Czarnik's** cousin, Robbie Czarnik, earned the bronze medal with the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team at the 2008 IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship.

• **CHAMPIONSHIP CONNECTIONS** -- In addition to the five players returning from last year's gold-medal team, a pair of coaches also return. Assistant coach **Tim Taylor** and goaltending coach **Joe Exter** both return. The pair also was part of the staff for the U.S. National Junior Team at the 2010 IIHF World Junior Championship. Taylor served as that team's director of player personnel, while Exter was the goaltending coach.

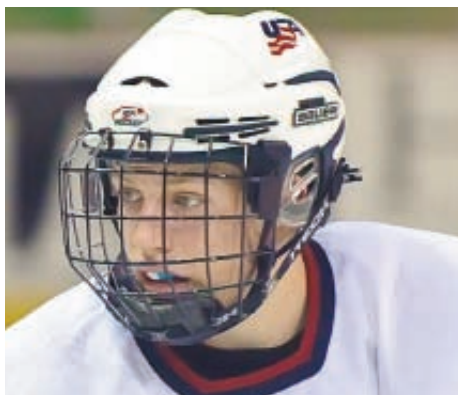
• **CENTRAL SCOUTING RANKINGS** -- Eleven draft-eligible players from the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team have been listed on the NHL Central Scouting Bureau's Final Rankings. **Derek Forbort** (Duluth, Minn.) is tops among current U.S. players at No. 7 among North American skaters. Additionally, Cam Fowler (Farmington Hills, Mich.), who led the U.S. to the gold medal at last year's IIHF World Under-18 Championship, is ranked at No. 5. Fowler received the directorate award as the tournament's best defenseman last season. • **NHL BLOODLINES** -- Two players on the U.S. roster have fathers that played in the National Hockey League. **Jarred Tinordi's** father, Mark, enjoyed a 12-year run in the NHL, which included stints with the New York Rangers, Minnesota North Stars/Dallas Stars and the Washington Capitals. **Tyler Biggs'** (Cincinnati, Ohio) father, Don, played 16 seasons of professional hockey, which included a brief run in the NHL with the Philadelphia Flyers and Minnesota North Stars. The elder Biggs also skated for teams in the American Hockey League, International Hockey League and East Coast Hockey League from 1984-2002. His number is retired by the Cincinnati Cyclones, now of the ECHL.

• **YOUNG GUNS** -- Of the 22 players on Team USA's roster, only two are from outside of the 1992 birth year. **Rocco Grimaldi** (Rossmore, Calif.) and **Tyler Biggs** were both born in 1993. The pair spent this past season with the U.S. National Under-17 Team at the National Team Development Program. The highlight of their young careers came on Jan. 5, 2010 when the pair led the U.S. Under-17 squad to the title at the 2010 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge in Timmins, Ont. Grimaldi led the tournament in scoring with 14 points (4-10), while Biggs scored both goals for the U.S. in its 2-1 win against Canada-Ontario in the championship game.

• **FUN FACTS** -- Team USA has received many good luck wishes from back home through email. One note came from Ron Wilson, head coach of the 2010 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team and the Toronto Maple Leafs. Additionally U.S. National Junior Team gold medalist and U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team bronze medalist, Danny Kristo and former NTDP head John Hynes, who also has the highest winning percentage of any U.S. coach at this tournament ... Also sending his well wishes was USA Hockey president, Ron DeGregorio ... Sergei Bychok, of Minsk, is Team USA's local host. His duties consist of helping the team staff get around town and translating for the U.S. delegation ... Only two members of Team USA's staff were at the 2004 IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship in Minsk. Equipment manager Brock Bradley and Scott Monaghan, director of operations, both were part of the staff that helped Team USA begin its medal streak with the silver in 2004.

• **FRESH FACE BEHIND THE BENCH** -- For the first time in six years, a head coach not named John Hynes or Ron Rolston will lead the U.S. Men's National Team at an IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship. **Kurt Kleinendorst** will guide Team USA for the first time at the event. This season, he led the U.S. National Under-18 Team of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program to a 36-18-2 record, including a 9-8-0 mark against U.S. college opponents, an 18-8-2 clip in the United States Hockey League. The team also compiled a 7-0-0-2 in international competition this season, which included a first-place finish at the 2009 Under-18 Four Nations Cup in Finland and second place at the 2010 Under-18 Six Nations Cup in Minsk, Belarus.

• **COACHING THE U.S. NATIONAL UNDER-18 TEAM** -- Kurt Kleinendorst becomes the sixth head coach to lead the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team at an IIHF World Men's Under-18 Championship. Below is a list of the five previous bench bosses.
