TODAY'S GAME: The undefeated United States (3-0-0-0) and the Czech Republic (2-0-0-1) meet in the semifinal round of the inaugural 2008 IIHF World Women's U18 Championship tonight. The winner will advance to Saturday's (Jan. 12) gold-medal game, while the losing team will play for the bronze medal. Team USA finished first in Group B with a trio of victories, while the Czech Republic finished second in Group A with a pair of wins and one loss. The United States is coming off a 6-2 win over Sweden on Wednesday (Jan. 9), after an 11-0 blanking of Switzerland on Tuesday (Jan. 8) and an 11-0 victory over Russia on Monday (Jan. 7). Meanwhile, the Czech Republic topped Germany, 3-2, on Wednesday (Jan. 9) after beating Finland, 5-3, on Tuesday (Jan. 8) and falling to Canada, 11-2, to start the tournament on Monday (Jan. 7). Tonight's other semifinal game features Canada and Sweden.

RECAPPING GAME 3 VS. SWEDEN: Paced by two-goals apiece from **Kendall Coyne** and **Brianna Decker**, Team USA earned a 6-2 victory over Sweden on Wednesday (Jan. 9) to finish undefeated in Group B. After taking an early 1-0 lead, Team USA fell behind 2-1 early in the second frame before tallying five unanswered goals for the 6-2 win.

RECAPPING GAME 2 VS. SWITZERLAND: A five-point effort by **Ashley Cottrell**, along with a hat trick from **Brooke Ammerman**, led Team USA to an 11-0 blanking of Switzerland in the second preliminary-round game for both teams on Tuesday (Jan. 8). Team USA out shot the Swiss team by a 63-4 count as 11 players contributed to the scoring, including six who had three or more points on the night. The Americans had five goals in both the first and third periods, along with one tally in the second to account for the 11-0 final score.

RECAPPING GAME 1 VS. RUSSIA: Led by a **Madison Packer** hat trick and goals from eight different players, Team USA posted a convincing 11-0 victory over Russia in the first game of tournament for both teams on Monday (Jan. 7). Team USA held a 67-3 shots advantage in the game and took a 3-0 advantage in the first period, then tallied four more times in both the second and third frames for the 7-0 final count.

GAME NOTES

- Team USA out shot Russia by a 67-3 count on Monday (Jan. 7), Switzerland by a 63-5 margin on Tuesday (Jan. 8) and Sweden by 41-14 on Wednesday (Jan. 9), having thus out shot opponents 171-22. The Americans have only allowed more than four shots in a period once (seven in the first period vs. Sweden) and have only tallied less than 15 shots in a period once (10 in the first period vs. Sweden).
- Sixteen of Team USA's 18 skaters have factored in the scoring in the United States' three victories, while 12 have scored at least one goal. Eight players had multiple-point games against Russia (Jan. 7), while seven did against Switzerland (Jan. 8). **Madison Packer** had a hat trick against Russia and **Brooke Ammerman** had one against the Swiss.
- Team USA is ranked second in the tournament with a 37.5% conversion rate on the power play, having scored six power-play goals on 16 chances, including going 3-for-4 on the power play against Russia on Monday (Jan. 7) and 3-for-8 against Switzerland on Tuesday (Jan. 8).
- The United States is the least penalized team of the tournament, having only incurred 12 penalties for 24 minutes in three games, including none

in Monday's (Jan. 7) game against Russia.

- Three U.S. players are among the tournament's top-10 scorers. **Ashley Cottrell** ranks fifth with eight points (4-4), while Amanda Kessel is seventh with two goals and six assists and **Madison Packer** ranks ninth overall with seven points (4-3). The four goals by both Cottrell and Packer ranks them fourth in tournament goal-scoring. **Alev Kelter** and Kessel share third place in the tournament with six assists apiece, while Kelter is second in defensemen scoring (0-6--6).

TEAM NOTES

- The average age of Team USA is 16.5 years old - **Meagan Mangene** is the youngest at 15 years and four months, while **Anne Schleper** is the oldest at 17 years and 11 months. In total, there are three 15 year olds, five 16 year olds and 12 17 year olds on the team.
- Nine players are making their Team USA debuts, including defensemen **Blake Bolden**, **Kasey Boucher**, **Alev Kelter** and **Sasha Sherry**, along with forwards **Amanda Kessel**, **Meagan Mangene**, **Madison Packer**, **Kelley Steadman** and **Elizabeth Turgeon**. The remaining 11 on the team played for the U.S. Women's Under-18 Select Team during the 2007 Under-18

Series with Canada last August.

- **Sarah Erickson** is serving as captain of the U.S. team, while **Brooke Ammerman** and **Kelly Wild** are the alternates. The trio also served as captains at the Under-18 series in August.
- Team USA recently completed a training camp in Lake Placid, N.Y. (Dec. 26-Jan. 1), where 22 players were vying for the 20 roster spots on the first-ever U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team. The camp was part of USA Hockey's Women's Holiday Camp that also included 35 over-18 players.
- The U.S. roster is one of the more geographically diverse groups that USA Hockey has put together, with players hailing from 12 different states, ranging from Maine to Alaska.
- Of the 12 players born in 1990 on the U.S. team, nine have already signed National Letters of Intent to play college hockey in the United States. Of the remaining three, two are still juniors in high school and have yet to decide what school they will attend, while **Sasha Sherry** is already a freshman at Princeton University after graduating from Shattuck-St. Mary's (Minn.) in just three years.

The pair of **Blake Bolden** and **Kelley Steadman** play for Northwood School (N.Y), the duo of **Ashley Cottrell** and **Madison Packer** play for Little Caesars U19 (Mich.), the trio of **Kasey Boucher**, **Brooke Ammerman** and **Meagan Mangene** play for the North American Hockey Academy (Vt.) and the trio of **Rebecca Ruegsegger**, **Brianna Decker** and **Amanda Kessel** play for Shattuck-St. Mary's.
- Both **Alev Kelter** and **Elizabeth Turgeon** have twin sisters.
- **Amanda Kessel** is the younger sister of Phil Kessel, who currently plays for the National Hockey League's Boston Bruins. He is a two-year alumnus of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program (2003-05) and has competed in two IIHF World U18 Championships (2004-05), two IIHF World Junior Championships (2005-06) and two IIHF Men's World Championships (2006-07) as part of Team USA. Amanda and Phil are also the cousins of David Moss, who currently plays locally for the NHL's Calgary Flames.
- **Elizabeth Turgeon** is the daughter of Pierre Turgeon, who enjoyed a 19-year NHL playing career that included stops in Buffalo, New York (Islanders), Montreal, St. Louis, Dallas and Colorado.
- **Rebecca Ruegsegger** is the younger sister of Tyler Ruegsegger, who recently competed with the U.S. National Junior Team at the 2008 IIHF World Junior Championship in the Czech Republic. He also plays college hockey at the University of Denver.

THE COACHING STAFF: **Katey Stone**, head women's hockey coach at Harvard University, is serving as head coach for Team USA. It marks her first time coaching at a IIHF event. She recently served as head coach of the 2006 U.S. Women's Under-22 Select Team for the Under-22 Series with Canada. Joining her as assistant coaches are **Erin Whitten Hamlen**, associate women's ice hockey coach at the University of New Hampshire, and **Bob Deraney**, head women's ice hockey coach at Providence College. Whitten Hamlen spent the 2006-07 season as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team, seeing international action at the 2006 Women's Four Nations Cup and the 2007 IIHF World Women's Championship.
