From Pittsburgh/Greensburg:

Route 22 to Indiana Exit (Route 119 North). Follow 119 North past Homer City. Take the Indiana/Clymer exit (route 286). Follow exit ramp to traffic light. Turn left at traffic light onto East Pike. Rink is ½ mile on the left.

From Kittanning/Butler:

Follow Route 28 North to Route 422 East in Kittanning. Follow Route 422 East to Indiana. Take Philadelphia Street exit. Follow Philadelphia Street (main Street in Indiana) to the end of town.
At end of town, Bear Right onto East pike. Rink is ½ mile on the left.

From Ebensburg (East):

Follow Route 422 West into Indiana. Take Route 119 North Exit.
Take Indiana/Clymer Exit (Route 286). Follow Exit ramp to Traffic light. Turn left at Traffic light onto East Pike.
Rink is ½ mile on the left.

From Johnstown:

Take Route 403 to Route 22. Turn left on Route 22. Follow Route 22 for 1 mile. Take exit to Indiana (route 56).
Take route 56 to 6th street extension (3 miles outside Brush Valley, turn Right at bottom of hill at Budner's Restaurant). Follow 6th Street Extension to Philadelphia Street (main street in Indiana). Turn Right onto Philadelphia Street and follow to end of town. At end of town, Bear Right onto East Pike. Rink is ½ mile on the Left

2009 Charlie Hogan Tournament Rules of Play

1. All teams must register and sign in with their USA Hockey Roster and birth certificate copies prior to their first game. All players and head coach or team manager must sign in at the registration desk prior to each subsequent game. All teams must be equipped according to USA Hockey Rules.
2. All games will have three (3) twelve (12) minute periods.
3. An EMT will be present on the bench at every game. In the event of an injury to a player or referee, the game will be stopped by the referee on his/her whistle. Note that play may continue after a player is down if the referee determines that the individual is not in immediate danger. The EMT will attend to the player on-ice and/or on the bench. **For the safety of all, NO spectators are permitted on ice while the EMT is attending to an injured individual.** The EMT will make the determination if an individual needs further attention during game time at the nearest facility, Indiana Regional Medical Center, regardless of credentials held by coaches, parents or other spectators.
4. Curfew Clock- All games will have a curfew clock. Curfew clock starts at the first drop of the puck by the referee. Play will continue until the end of the game clock or until the curfew clock expires- whichever occurs first regardless of penalties or injuries. ***No exceptions.***
5. Teams must be ready to play fifteen (15) minutes prior to the scheduled start of their game. If a previous game end early, the following game may start early.
6. Teams will have five (5) minutes to warm-up prior to their game AFTER the Zamboni has left the ice AND the Zamboni doors have been closed. The five (5) minute warm-up is **NOT** part of the curfew time- curfew clock starts at the first drop of the puck by the referee. At no point is a team allowed on the ice for warm-up without at least one of their coaches present. If the five (5) minute warm-up starts and a team is not ready or a coach is not available to go on ice with them, that team will **not** receive extra warm-up time.
7. LOCKER ROOMS- Each team will be assigned a locker room for each game and will be required to sign out a locker room key at the registration table. Teams with female players will have a female locker room available for them. A set of keys or driver's license is required to sign out a key(s). This will be returned upon the sign in of the key(s). Locker rooms will be inspected after each team. The rooms are to be left free of debris, bottles, tape balls, paper, etc. Please inform tournament volunteers at registration table of any damage or problems in locker room upon entrance. Teams will be charged for damage to a locker room.
8. UNIFORMS- In each game the "home" team will be designated prior to the game. The "home" team will wear their light jerseys and the "away" team will wear their dark

jerseys- each team will then use the bench marked accordingly. In the championship games, the team with the highest amount of total points will be the “home” team.

9. Whenever possible, teams will enter and exit the ice through different doors. In the event teams must enter and exit through the same doors, the “home” team (light colored jersey) will enter and exit ALL players and coaches first. The “away” team (dark colored jersey) will wait along the boards until the “home” team (light colored jersey) has completely exited the ice. At no point is a spectator permitted to open the ice doors for a player- a tournament volunteer will be at the doors to assist a player if necessary.
10. In the spirit of good sportsmanship it is encouraged that all players and coaches participate in the traditional hand shake after a game, unless the *referee(s) deems it unsafe for the players and coaches*. In that event the referee(s) will have teams leave the ice as described in rule 8 with the possibility the “away” team maybe held on ice until the “home” team has completely entered their locker room.
11. PENALTIES- No appeals will be allowed. The penalty determination(s) of the game referees are final.
 - a. Minor- 2:00 minutes
 - b. Major- 5:00 minutes
 - c. Misconduct- 10:00 minutes
 - d. Game Misconduct- Misconduct time designated in Rule 11 Subsection C and suspension from next game.
 - e. Match and Gross Misconduct- Expulsion from remainder of the tournament and will leave ice immediately accompanied by a coach. At no time is individual allowed to be alone in locker room or facility following expulsion. Team is responsible for actions of any individual expelled from tournament.
12. Time-Outs- Each team will be provided the opportunity to call one (1) one (1) minute time-out per game.
13. TOURNAMENT SCORING- Each game is worth a maximum of five (5) points: one (1) point highest number of goals scored per period, two (2) points for winning overall game. In the event of a tie period or tie final score, points will be split. The top two (2) teams, according to total points, will play in the championship game. Game points will be posted after score sheet has been properly verified by tournament registrar/official only.
14. TIE-BREAKERS:
 - a. To determine championship game participants:
 - i. Head-to-head record
 - ii. Least goals allowed
 - iii. Least penalty minutes assessed
 - iv. Most periods won
 - b. Championship Game:
 - i. Five (5) minute sudden death overtime, 4 on 4 with running clock.

- ii. Five (5) player shootout. Both teams will get all five (5) chances.
 - iii. Sudden death shootout. Both teams **MUST** use five (5) **different** players from the first five (5) player shootout. The winner will be the first team to score in the shooting round when the other team does not. The same five (5) players will continue to shoot in the same starting rotation until a winner is determined.
15. Photos will be taken by the official tournament photographer. Spectators will be permitted on-ice for team pictures at the tournament officials' discretion **ONLY** at the end of the championship game after trophies are awarded for no more than five (5) minutes. Spectators enter ice at their own risk !
16. Tournament facility is a tobacco free facility. This applies to all individuals inside facility and encompasses cigarettes, cigars, pipes, snuff and chewing tobacco- no exceptions.
17. Protests- **No** protests will be allowed. Tournament officials will interpret all rules and decide issues not covered by rules stated above. Tournament officials' decisions are final.
18. Tournament is sanctioned by USA Hockey and is played under the USA Hockey Zero Tolerance Policy. There are **NO EXCEPTIONS** to the Zero Tolerance Policy!!! See posters in facility for further details.
