• **TONIGHT'S GAME** -- The United States and Russia meet today for the bronze medal in the 2008 World Junior Championship. Team USA earned a 3-2 win over Russia earlier in the tournament in preliminary round play.

• **RECORD vs. RUSSIA** -- The U.S. and Russia meet for 25th time today. In the all-time series, Russia holds an 18-6-0 advantage. The teams met in the preliminary round of this year's tournament with Team USA gaining a 3-2 victory.

• **MEDAL CHANCE** -- Team USA looks to win a medal in the World Junior Championship for the second straight year. The United States has never won back-to-back medals in the event. Last year, Team USA captured the bronze medal with a 2-1 win over host Sweden. Team USA is playing in the bronze medal game for the fourth straight year.

• **ELIGIBLE TO RETURN** -- Eight players are eligible to return for the World Junior Championship next year, including goaltender **Jeremy Smith** (Brownstown, Mich./Plymouth); defensemen **Jonathon Blum** (Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif./Vancouver), **Ian Cole** (Ann Arbor, Mich./University of Notre Dame) and **Cade Fairchild** (Duluth, Minn./University of Minnesota); and forwards **Matt Rust** (Bloomfield Hills, Mich./University of Michigan); **Jordan Schroeder** (Prior Lake, Minn./U.S. National Under-18 Team); **James vanRiemsdyk** (Middletown, N.J./University of New Hampshire); and **Colin Wilson** (Greenwich, Conn./Boston University).

• **vanRIEMSDYK CONTINUES TO LEAD TOURNEY** -- **James vanRiemsdyk** (Lumberton, N.J./University of New Hampshire), had a goal last night and is the only U.S. player to have at least one game in every game of the 2008 World Junior Championship. vanRiemsdyk is first in the tournament in points with 5-6--11, tied for third in goals with five and tied for third in assists with six.

• **WILSON TIED FOR LEAD IN GOALS** -- **Colin Wilson** (Greenwich, Conn.) is tied for the tournament lead in goals with six heading into play today. Wilson had a natural hat trick in Team USA's win over Finland on New Year's Eve in the preliminary round. Wilson's father Carey played nine years in the National Hockey League with 169-258--427 in 552 regular-season games. He played college hockey at Dartmouth for two years with his NHL career including stints with the Hartford Whalers, New York Rangers and Calgary Flames after two years in HIFK Helsinki.

• **HOCKEY NEWS LIST OF POWER AND INFLUENCE** -- **Dave Ogrean**, USA Hockey's Executive Director, is listed by *The Hockey News* as 37th on its list of the Top 100 People of Power and Influence in hockey. Ogrean, one of the most dynamic leaders in amateur sports in the United States, was 43rd in last year's rankings. In addition, **Jim Johannson**, USA Hockey's assistant executive director for hockey operations, is No. 77 and is making his first-ever appearance on the list.

• **THIS AND THAT** -- Team USA is 1-0 in games that start at 4 p.m. in the 2008 World Junior Championship (5-1 win over Kazakhstan in opening game of event on Dec. 26) ... **Stan Wong** (Boca Raton, Fla.), with 16 years of NHL experience, has been Team USA's trainer at the WJC for the past six years ... U.S. assistant coach **Patrick Foley**, a former player and coach in USA Hockey's National Team Development Program and now an assistant men's ice hockey coach at Harvard University, made a presentation focusing on the penalty kill to approximately 200 Czech coaches yesterday as part of an IIHF/Czech Ice Hockey Federation coaches clinic at Pardubice University ... The U.S. National Sled Hockey Team is conducting a three-day training camp in Colorado Springs this weekend ... **Lou Vairo**, USA Hockey's director of special projects and the 1984 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Coach, will be the head coach for a group of World All-Stars that will play two outdoor games against the Russian team GazpromExport. The first contest is slated for Jan. 18 at Palace Square in St. Petersburg, with the second game on Jan. 20 in Moscow's Red Square.

• **COACHING STAFF NOTES** -- Team USA Head Coach **John Hynes** is 16-1-0 as a head coach in IIHF World Championship play, including 12-1-0 in the World Under-18 Championship and 4-0-0 in the World Junior Championship ... Team USA assistant coach **Keith Allain**, the head men's ice hockey coach at Yale University, has a wealth of experience in World Championship play. He has been a member of the U.S. coaching staff in four World Junior Championships (2008, 2002, 2001, 2000), two Olympics (2006, 1992), two World Cups (2004, 1996) and two Men's World Championships (2005, 2006) ... Team USA assistant coach **Patrick Foley** played in the 2000 WJC and helped Team USA to a fourth-place finish.

• **SINCE THE NTDP** -- The U.S. is 46-27-6 (.620) in the World Junior Championship since the launch of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program in 1996. Previous to that, the U.S. had a combined 52-75-5 (.413) mark.

• **BROADCAST TEAM** -- **Jack Swanson** (play-by-play) and **Jeff Sauer** (color) are calling all Team USA games for usahockey.com's live audiocast during the World Junior Championship. Swanson, who currently lives in Roseau, Minn., is the former play-by-play radio voice of the Wisconsin Badgers (1986-96), while Sauer is a former NCAA Division I men's ice hockey head coach at the University of Wisconsin (1983-2002) and Colorado College (1971-82).

He works full-time for USA Hockey as its assistant executive director of hockey operations. Johannson played in both the 1983 and 1984 World Junior Championship and recorded 7-5--12 in 14 total games played ... **Cameron Eickmeyer**, the managing editor of usahockey.com, is here covering the tournament.

• **UPCOMING IIHF WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS IN USA** -- The United States will host the 2009 IIHF World Under-18 Men's Championship; the 2011 IIHF World Under-20 Championship; and the 2012 IIHF World Women's Championship. The site for the 2009 IIHF World Under-18 Men's Championship is expected to be announced within the next month.

• **CELEBRATING THE IIHF 100TH ANNIVERSARY** -- The United States is conducting a nationwide 24-Hour Hockey Game on Feb. 29, 2008, to help celebrate the IIHF's 100th anniversary. Each of the lower 48 states in the USA will play a 30-minute running-time game, beginning with Maine at 12 noon ET on Feb. 29. The states of Hawaii and Alaska will each play a 30-minute running-time "overtime" period. (48 states x 30 minutes = 24 hours, plus overtime). The 24-Hour Game will end at 1 p.m. ET on March 1.
